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

Artwork and/or photos used must be original designs, no copyrights, with the use of bold colors.

Actual sizes of the finished posters are 18"x24" and 11"x17". Artwork does not need to be that size, but needs to work within those proportions. The 11"x17" poster is an informational poster.

Copies of previous years' posters are available in digital format upon request. These posters may be used as a guideline for some of the content required in the design.

The winning artist will work with CASI staff in making requested edits or changes to develop the final version of their design. Artwork must be digital or camera ready. If selected, artist agrees to relinquish ownership of artwork.



Page 16 Terlingua Trails CASI Chili and the Super Bowl

There are still some CASI cooks around that know that there is an historic connection between the NFL Super Bowl and the CASI "Bowl of Red". In preparing to write this piece, a lot of the specific details have slipped into the "forgotten zone", but it is still a fascinating story, so please don't be too critical of any incorrect details. The whole CASI-Super Bowl story is so great. So, here it goes!

CASI cooks were involved in not one, but TWO SUPER BOWLS: SB XLII held in 2008 (Giants vs. Patriots) and SB XLIX held in 2015 (Seahawks vs. Patriots). Both took place in Glendale, Arizona.



Each involved two cooking events: a normal CASI cook-off before Super Bowl Sunday and the actual Super Bowl chili event held more as a People's Choice event inside the stadium on gameday.

The first adventure began in late 2007 when CASA Pod, the Chili Appreciation Society Arizona, heard that the organizers of Super Bowl XLII were looking for VIP Tailgate Party activities that would bring local color to the event.



CASA Pod offered to hold a chili cook-off and the NFL Events

Committee contractor accepted. CASI cook Roland Regeon handled most of the not so simple logistics.

News about a Super Bowl cookoff unleashed a crush of activity including getting an OK from CASI (which never really came), learning what the individual chili preparation scenarios were going to be, identifying all the people that would participate in the cook-off so they could be cleared by NFL security and then getting everybody to the right place at the right time.

The call went out and over 40 CASI cooks from Arizona, New Mexico and Texas answered. They were organized into teams of two members each. After some unusual preparations I'm about to detail, the teams headed for Glendale.

The schedule: The CASI cookoff was on Saturday, the day before "Super Sunday". On gameday, the cooks would offer chili samples in the VIP Tailgate Party area. VIP tasters would vote for their

favorite. So far it sounds straight forward, right? Well, not so fast.

Here is how it worked; for the game day VIP Tailgate party each participating team had to cook no less than 15 gallons of chili at home. Then freeze it and bring it to Glendale in their RV, or the back seat of their car-whatever. For security reasons, the group of cooks were assigned a parking area five miles from the stadium. Once everyone was in the parking area, all the chili was transported on a flat cargo trailer to freezers inside the Super Bowl security zone.



For the regular CASI cookoff, cooks went by charter bus from the parking area to the security area where everyone was issued a photo security badge. We went in under the watchful eye of security.



The Saturday CASI cook-off went off like any other cook-off except it was inside the Super Bowl venue while the setup work for the big game was going on. Fires were lit, chili turned in, judges went to work, and winners announced.

At the end of the day everyone could have some fun in the NFL Events entertainment area before we were bussed back to the



parking area where a pretty healthy party went on. We had to be careful because the next day we had an early wake up and head for the VIP Tailgate area which had been completed and secured overnight.

On Super Bowl morning, the same drill; we were bussed to the site, cleared through security. Cooks then went to the VIP Tailgate area where team cook sites were set up. Using funds provided by the Events Committee contractor, each cook site was provided two electric roaster ovens and utensils (we got to keep them).



The thawing, heating, and serving process was crazy (we were under the annoying eye of the county health department), but when the tailgate party area opened, everyone was ready, and the people came in waves. It was a huge People's Choice event. Among the stars Ryan Seacrest, Alicia Keys, Willie Nelson and

lots or the rich and famous came through the cook area, sampled the chili. To vote for their favorite, the tasters had to remember the booth number or chili name. They went off to a special area where they voted. There was a lot of lobbying, trash talk and probably even a bribe or two to be sure a taster voted the right way. It was really exhausting, but fun.

After the awards, cooks marched back to the bussing area to head back to our RVs. Traffic was a mess and in the confusion of game day, the buses for our return trip didn't show. Super tired cooks flagged taxis, airport limos and even friendly passersby and mooched or paid for a ride back to the parking area. There were several outdoor TVs and that is where we watched Super Bowl XLII.

Everyone had a really good time, but it was such hard work, no one was sure they would every volunteer again! But as we know, time heals all wounds (and tired legs). So, when a similar opportunity came up in 2015, there was no shortage of volunteer cooks.



Super Bowl XLIX was coming back to Glendale in 2015. Interest in a CASI redux started getting momentum in late 2014. The specifics are a bit obscure, but once again, the NFL Events Committee and Arizona CASI cooks married

up. The prime movers for the 2015 effort were CASI cooks Sonja Streich and her husband Scott, owners of a catering business in the Phoenix area. The scenario for 2015 was going to be a lot different. The county health department insisted that all chili be cooked in an approved kitchen on-site. Further, the CASI Chili cook-off prior to game day could not be held on stadium grounds!

The call went out early for cooks. Recalling what a blast the first Super Bowl experience was like, over 50 CASI cooks responded from around the country. and had to be cleared by NFL security.



Sonja and Scott proved to be geniuses in solving problems. RV parking was reserved in the public tailgater's area in front of a large Cabela's store for the CASI cook-off. The CASI cookoff was like Mardi Gras. The usual colorful popups, beautifully decorated with show themes were

everywhere. There wasn't a glitch until things got bogged down while seating judges and wrangling chili. A couple of brave and very experienced Texas cooks jumped in and quickly smoothed things out. It was an enormous success all the way around.

What about those on site cooking requirements? Wizards Sonja and Scott (S&S) found a vocational high school just minutes away from where cooks parked. The school agreed to rent their kitchens for chili cooking and the health department approved it!

The wizardry didn't stop there. "S&S" also devised a logistical plan. Using funds provided by the NFL Events Committee contractor they created a cookoff pantry in two trailers from which cooks could draw everything they



needed to prepare chili. Meat was in refrigerators. Spices were lined up on shelves along with knives, spoons, cutting boards, pots, and pans. The "commissary" was set up in the parking lot of the high *Story continued next page...*

school. Cooks lined up, drew what each thought they needed, headed into the commercial kitchen and started cooking under the watchful eye of the health department. Again, the amount each team had to prepare a bunch. The kitchen was wonderful chaos!

Numerous small pots of chili were merged into large pots of chili that at the end of the day were to be moved to the game day VIP Tailgate area. The pots of chili cooled in sinks full of ice so they could be transported.



Teams worked very hard. Late in the afternoon we learned that one team would not make it to the kitchen, so at the 11th hour one more batch had to be made! Everybody dove in and cooked smaller pots of chili to be consolidated into one last large pot. There were plenty of tired cooks ready to head back to their RVs and hotels for some rest.

The next morning cooks, in their colorful CASI outfits, security badges in hand, boarded



buses for the VIP Tailgate area. For this event, the chili tasting area was the first thing inside the VIP gate. Rows of booths had been set up



and each team found their home, outfitted with electric countertop burners and everything else needed. The coolest thing was how



voting was handled at this massive People's Choice event. The NFL Events Committee contractor set up a system where tasters could text in their vote.





Chaos in the kitchen? Or just a normal day of chili cooks?

Cooks served tons of chili, votes were tallied, trophies presented, and before the first play, the tired cooks headed back to camp.

There was Super Bowl memorabilia for everyone. Although the security passes clearly said "No Stadium Access" there is a story that a couple of brave West Texans (not further identified) blended in with the entering crowd and found seats in the stadium. For the rest of the cooks, Super Bowl XLIX was over.

So there you have it.
The story of how CASI cooks became part of the history of two Super Bowls. By the way, the Super Bowl is scheduled to return to Glendale, Arizona once again in 2023.







Make No Mistake: Cooks Meeting, Should I Go?

When was the last time you attended a Head Cooks Meeting? Some cookoffs routinely have them while other cookoffs rarely, if ever, have them. I understand that RULE BOOK in today's CASI there are certain challenges involved in holding a cooks meeting. At very large cookoffs, getting all the cooks together in one place at the same time is a logistical challenge, while very small cookoffs with all regular cooks would have difficulty having anything to say. When I started my CASI career, everyone was cooking with hand-cut meat, the normal cooking time was three hours, so the cooks meeting was normally four hours prior to turn-in time. Now, with the advent of ground meat the cooking time is reduced, and some cooks do not arrive at the site until others have started cooking. Regardless the challenges, a Head Cooks Meeting is an essential part of the chili cookoff.

Is a Head Cooks Meeting required? Technically, the

answer is no. There is no specific rule in the book that state that a cookoff must hold a cooks meeting. However, there is a reference to such a meeting in Rule I.F, and there are several pages in the Guidelines devoted to the cooks meeting. All these references suggest that the cooks meeting is expected.


In last month's article, I discussed staying true to the information contained in the CASI Cookoff Listing. CASI Rule I.F tells us that the chili will be turned in at the time

and place designated at the cooks meeting. If, for some reason, there needed to be a deviation from the cookoff listing, the cooks meeting would be the opportunity to announce that change. And do so within CASI Rules.

Is the Head Cooks Meeting beneficial? Absolutely. When a cook attends a cookoff, he/she wants to feel welcome and informed. Make no mistake, the cooks meeting affords that exact opportunity. It is an opportunity to meet and greet the other cooks, to socialize. Many cookoffs have developed cooks meeting traditions over the years; from the National Anthem, saying the Pledge of Allegiance, to having a shot of tequila.

The Head Cooks Meeting can be, and should be fun, as well as informative. Let's embrace this concept.






