

It is time once again to get creative and start thinking about artwork designs to promote and commemorate the 2022 Terlingua International Chili Championship (TICC). This will be the 55th TICC and CASI is looking for unique, creative designs that embody the essence of the TICC and CASI. *The deadline to submit your artwork designs is Monday, June 13, 2022.*

Poster Guidelines

June 2022

When designing the art, please keep in mind that the poster is a vital element to the success of the event. The chosen artwork will not only become the official poster of the Terlingua International Chili Championship, but may also be used to develop retail merchandise such as T-shirts and hoodies.

Artwork *must* incorporate the following elements:

Name of Event: Terlingua International Chili Championship Annual Designation: 55th Annual Location: Held at Rancho CASI de los Chisos

Date of Event: November 5, 2022

Artist should keep in mind that the Sponsor logos, CASI logos, pictures of the previous year's winners and names of the current Board members will be included in the finished poster.

Artwork and/or photos used must be original designs, no copyrights, with the use of bold colors.

Actual sizes of the finished posters are 18"x24" and 11"x17". Artwork does not need to be that size, but needs to work within those proportions. The 11"x17" poster is an informational poster. Copies of previous years' posters are available in digital format upon request. These posters may be used as a guideline for some of the content required in the design.


The winning artist will work with CASI staff in making requested edits or changes to develop the final version of their design. Artwork must be digital or camera ready. If selected, artist agrees to relinquish ownership of artwork.

If selected, artwork becomes the sole property of the Chili Appreciation Society International, Inc. The winning designer will receive credit with their name included on the final products.



If selected, artist agrees to sign and number fifty prints within 30 days of request.







June 2022 Terlingua Trails Page 25 Make No Mistake: Referees Vital Spoke in CASI Wheel

Have you ever wondered why we have referees? Make no mistake, our referees are an important part of the CASI ecosystem. This system actually CASI pre-dates modern RULE CASI. Originally, BOOK the Regional and Area Referees were appointed, and reported to, the CASI Board. In 1983 the selection of referees was transferred to the CASI Pods. The CASI Executive Director was responsible for the referees until 2015 when the Senior Referee position was created and the responsibility shifted to that person.

CASI continued to grow through the eighties and nineties, and the referee position grew with it and became more refined as to responsibilities. In the early 2000's the regions were more accurately defined with the associated pods and Regional Referees responsible for those regions. I should point out here that Referee Regions and Regional Open Regions are defined separately and are not associated with each other. We currently have 38 Regional Referees and 51 defined regions. The regions that have no pod in them, for the most part, are covered by an appointed Area Referee.

CASI has established rules and guidelines that must be adhered to in order for the cookoff to be sanctioned. Make no mistake, a cookoff

> is not sanctioned until the TallyMaster is satisfied that all the rules have been followed, and approves it for sanctioning. The cookoff referee is instrumental in getting that done. A

referee is assigned to attend a cookoff by their Regional Referee. They may cook if they so desire. The referee is to observe all facets of the cookoff from registration to awards to ensure that CASI rules are followed. If the referee notices an infraction, they should notify the head judge to get it corrected, if possible. If the infraction cannot be corrected at the cookoff, it must be reported to the Senior Referee. Even more important than that duty is submitting the cookoff paperwork. The cookoff referee must sign the Official

Results Sheet, verifying that all the information contained therein is accurate. The referee is "responsible" for sending the paperwork to the TallyMaster. The referee does not have to personally send the paperwork, or enter the results electronically, but they are responsible for it getting done. Make no mistake, the best way to do that is do it yourself.

There is a popular misconception that says the referee runs the judging. Nothing could be further from the truth, but in reality is very close. At many, mostly smaller cookoffs, you will find one or two people doing all the work. Usually one of those people would also be the referee. Plus, there is no better way to ensure the rules are followed at judging, than to do it yourself. Yeah, I have to plead guilty to that one.

As I hope you can see, the referee is a vital spoke in the CASI wheel. The integrity of our judging system depends on them. So, let me close by thanking all those who are currently serving as Regional and Area Referees, and all those who have done so in the past. *Your work often goes unnoticed, but is surely appreciated!*


