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From the CASI President...



Editor's Note: Renee Moore delivered this speech at the 43rd CASI Great Peppers' Meeting held September 10, 2022 in Gonzales, Texas.

When I became President last year, I knew I was walking

in the footsteps of those who came before me. Those who not only made this organization great but also kept it functioning over the years; through the good and the bad, the bountiful and the lean. Thanks to all of them, who couldn't have done it without the support of a good Board of Directors, the Great Peppers and the CASI membership. I would like to recognize those past Board members who are in attendance.

The Board of Directors isn't an autonomous group but rather work for you all; we serve at your pleasure. Over the last couple of weeks, I have spoken to several Great Peppers who asked questions based on 'what they had been told' by someone. I am glad they took the initiative to reach out and obtain the answers, which they can now provide to their Pod members and/or CASI membership when asked.

If there are questions that you have based on "something the Board did or didn't do", please contact one of the Board members and get the answer. If you don't have all the answers, perhaps you aren't asking the right questions or not asking the questions of those who can provide the answers.

Don't question the Board as to "why we did something", but question us as to "why <u>don't</u> we do something"—that is looking toward the future, not the past. The Board cannot come up with all the answers or solve all the problems, just as your Pods can't.

Communication is a two-way street. The Board provides information directly to the Great Peppers for sharing with their Pod members. Likewise, information is provided in the *Terlingua Trails* and on Facebook. Thank you to those who share that information, and I encourage you all to do so.

CASI still faces the issues that most organizations are facing today – age of the membership. We don't have the answers, nor do the other organizations, on how to increase membership with younger members to ensure the viability of the organization. We lost three Pods at this meeting due to no longer having members willing to keep those Pods alive. The plain and simple truth is that many do not have the time to devote to chili cooking. Most have families that have soccer games, football games, dance competitions and other functions that keep them from participating in our great hobby on Saturdays. All we can do is continue recruiting and hope we can reach them.

Several years ago, I read Jim Collins' bestseller, "Good to Great", which I mentioned at a previous meeting. The message is the same today. We are a good organization but can be a great organization; we have to work together for the good of the Board, the Pods, and the membership.

A bus needs passengers – the bus is CASI. The CASI members are those passengers, with the Great Peppers driving the bus and the Board of Directors serving as dispatchers. The bus must have a destination – where do we want to go? For if we don't know where we want to go, how will we know when we arrive?

The Board cannot be successful or make progress alone. Yes, we are tasked with coordinating and producing the Terlingua International Chili Championship, but we cannot do it alone. We need the help of each and every one of the membership. Many times when asking someone to volunteer I hear, 'that's my vacation'. Guess what? It is the vacation of each and every one of the Board of Directors, too. What if we all felt that way? We appreciate those who volunteer, not only at Terlingua but at cook-offs throughout the year.

I encourage you and your Pod members to visit Sign-Up Genius and volunteer for at least one shift at TICC. We are only asking for a few hours of your time, but those few hours go a long way in supporting your Board of Directors and, in turn, the organization and helping the event be successful.







From the CASI Executive Director...

I think everyone feels the same way, by saying Thank you, Wendell, for the decades of dazzling us with your beautiful painted stoves and brilliant displays of artistry. Although you are retired from painting, you are not retired from cooking chili, and we look forward to seeing you on the chili trail in the future.

Next, a big thank you to Jennifer Sherfield for her many years of service to the organization and the CASI Board of Directors. Her dedication cannot be argued, she was a worker and a doer. She would help anywhere when asked. We wish her much success and look forward to seeing her on the chili trail.

A similar study was performed six years ago. They have visited the ranch, and we expect to see their report in the coming weeks. I am anxious to see this report and learn more about the desert plants on the ranch.

Onward to a new chili year and see you at TICC!

In closing, I certainly hope your time here in Gonzales and the 43rd Great Peppers Meeting has been enjoyable one.

Make No Mistake: Cookin' for CASI Designation

Recently I received two updates for listings of cookoffs that had already taken place. I was curious as to why these particular listings were being updated, so I asked. It turns out that these events were tagged as Cookin' for CASI events, when they really were not. When registering a cook-off online, there

is a check box for a Cookin' for CASI event. I imagine that some people, not knowing that a Cookin' for CASI event is different from a CASI sanctioned event, check that box because they intend to get CASI sanctioning. Make no mistake, a Cookin' for CASI cookoff is different than a normal CASI sanctioned cookoff.

The Cookin' for CASI cook-off was established several years ago as a means for CASI to raise some money. The event does come with some rules; "Cookin' for CASI" must be included in the cook-off name, not buried down in the description. Also, all proceeds from the cook-off must go to CASI, not any other charity. To alleviate fears in smaller states (not Texas) that adding a cook-off might increase their required point total in the next year, the Cookin' for CASI cookoff


was made exempt from that count of cook-offs.

Make no mistake, Cookin' for CASI cook-offs are worthwhile events, and anyone is encouraged to hold one, but please understand the requirements that go with it. And understand that they are a little different than a normal cook-off.

The elections at the recent Great Peppers' Meeting have produced a new TallyMaster. Congratulations to Melissa Pate, our new TallyMaster, as well as the other election winners. Melissa previously served as the Assistant TallyMaster, so I would expect a seamless transition from Brian to Melissa. 




