GLEN ROSE, TEXAS—Seventy-six chili cooks braved a strong north wind and temperatures in the upper teens at the U.S. National Open Chili Championship held in honor of Larry Burruss on February 11th. Although the temperature had warmed by turnin time, the winds howled for the remainder of the day. Six TICC Champions were in attendance including the current champ Kris Hudspeth '22, Doris Coats '91, Lisa Stone '16, Larry Walton '11, Jason Goains '14, and two-time TICC champion Tom Dozier '10 & '18.

Just a week after the fire, they traveled to Lubbock High School to compete in regionals against 36 of the best teams from the Panhandle and West Texas. Although they placed 28th, the judges were so impressed, they presented them with the prestigious "Judges Award"!


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U.S. National Open Championship Application







Make No Mistake: Getting more cooks to TICC

I do not believe that anyone is satisfied or happy about the declining participation at TICC. This decline began ten years ago, so it is not a new problem. There was a little spike for our 50th TICC in 2016 and although the following years had reasonable participation, it has proved to not be sustainable.. At the time, a lot of the blame was directed at us older cooks because we were getting old and in some cases, passing. Make no mistake, we older cooks are not happy about the getting old thing either! Then there was the pandemic. That had a devastating effect on much of life as we knew it.

So here we are with two

belt. We have made modest gains in getting cooks back, but we must do more to increase qualified cook's attendance and participation at TICC. There is no easy solution. If there was, it would have been done by now. I feel (and I think most would agree) that TICC should remain an event requiring qualification. However, there might be some ways to expand the field of qualified cooks.

The obvious target would be the number of points required to earn qualification. There are a couple of ways to approach this. One method would be to reduce the number of points required to gain an invite to TICC. The CASI Board did this in 2020 when it became apparent the number of canceled cook-offs would not provide a sufficient field of cooks for TICC. I think the plan would have worked, but ultimately Brewster County said, no to the 2020 cook-offs.

Another approach would be to increase the number of points given to the top ten winners, or even increase the number of cooks getting points-if the size of the cook-off warranted it. I am intentionally not giving specific details for these ideas.

There are numerous possible solutions and I want all the Great Peppers to put on their thinking caps. Make no mistake, something must be done for TICC to thrive and survive.

Then there are the automatic qualifying cook-offs. We seem to have a lot of those, so I don't know if there is anything needed to make those easier to qualify.

Here is a random thought: The Tuesday cook-off at TICC routinely gets over 100 cooks.

Even in our recent down years, there were over 100 cooks. What if this event was elevated to the level of a regional open where the top three cooks qualify? It would be a Terlingua championship for all cooks, whether they qualified for TICC or not. There is a provision in CASI Rules to do this: It is called the CASI Special Open Championship.

We need to do something! Bill Pierson


