



Artist should keep in mind that the Sponsor logos, CASI logos, pictures of the previous year's winners and names of the current Board members will be included in the finished poster.

Artwork and/or photos used must be original designs, no copyrights, with the use of bold colors.

Actual sizes of the finished posters are 18"x24" and 11"x17". Submissions do not need to be that size, but they need to maintain those general proportions. The 11"x17" poster is an informational poster used to advertise TICC.

Copies of previous years' posters are available in digital format upon request. These posters may be used as a guideline for some of the content required in the design.



If selected, artist agrees to sign and number fifty prints within 30 days of request.



Make No Mistake: Know How to Auto-Q for TICC

There are many rules that deal with an automatic qualification to TICC. Thirty years ago, it was easy, there were only three ways to automatically qualify for the next TICC: you could win TICC (2nd and 3rd place qualified for the next year only), you could place in the top three of any regional or international open, or you could be one of the top three resident cooks at a state championship.

Over the years, many caveats have been added to the rules that made it possible for additional cooks (and show teams) to qualify for TICC. Because the new rules, and changes to existing rules were authored by many different people over a long period of time, confusion was created at times. In order to *make no mistake*, here is a breakdown of the various rules affecting automatic qualifications:

PAST TICC WINNERS

Past TICC winners have always been granted the right to participate in future TICC's. In 1993 the rules were revised to make that clear by adding, "eligible for life" to the rule. At that time, the rule was also changed to allow the rest of the top ten to be qualified for the next TICC. **R**EGIONAL & INTERNATIONAL OPENS:

Regional and international opens have always qualified the top three cooks. The national open and the special open fell under that policy when they were created. In 1996, a rule was added that would allow the opens to qualify five cooks and included the requirement that the open must maintain 300 entries for three years. This proved too difficult to accomplish, so, in 2003, that rule was revised to the current level of 150 chilis judged. The three-year period of maintaining that level was dropped.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS: State championships (including men's and women's) have always qualified the top three state resident cooks. In 2005, an addition to the residency requirement provided that the first place chili would also qualify for TICC, even if the cook was not a resident of that state. When the above mentioned rule on the enhanced number of chilis was passed, it also applied to state championships. In doing so, the language could be interpreted to mean that the top five cooks were the only ones to qualify regardless of residency. Make no mistake, the residency rule takes precedence in state championships.

More Auto-QUALIFICATION METHODS In 2014, two more methods of obtaining an automatic qualification were added to the CASI Rules Book. The winner of a CASI Pod Cook-off would be given an automatic qualification to TICC. This rule came with the caveat that the pod must be in good standing for five years. That was a long time to wait, especially for newly formed pods, so the period was reduced to two years in 2021. The rule ends with the phrase, "...regardless of number of cooks." *Make no mistake, that number must be fifteen or more.*

Another possible way to earn an automatic qualification was to win a regular cook-off that had a certain number of cooks based on the state's point requirement. A twelve-point state would need 100 cooks to take advantage of this provision. I believe, only the Tuesday cook-off in Terlingua is the only cook-off to take advantage of this. The nine-point state requires 75 cooks and at the six-point level 50 cooks are necessary to award an automatic qualification. Those are pretty high bars to reach.

SHOWMANSHIP

The rules for showmanship automatic qualification are quite similar to those for chili. Only, we are only qualifying the first place show team. Except at state championships, the same residency rules apply, so a nonresident show team could get the nod, as well as the resident winner.




